sustainability education program

Better Farm's Sustainability Education Program equips individuals with the knowledge and skills necessary to create a more sustainable future. Students will gain hands-on experience growing their own food, building their own green-living systems, acting as responsible land stewards, and serving the community. This program provides immersive training that will arm individuals with everyday solutions to environmental challenges we face as a global culture. Areas of study are tailored to each student, and may include:

- organic small-scale farming and gardening
- greenhouses and four-season farming
- beekeeping
- compost methods
- alternative building and energy
- rain and greywater collection
- aquaponics and hydroponics
- chicken care
- community outreach initiatives (supper clubs, volunteer work at area farms, workshops, presence at local events)
- homesteading (organic cooking, canning/preserving, soap-making and more)
- outdoor survival (edible wild plants, camping, fishing, emergency preparedness)

Better Farm's Sustainability Education Program runs in one- to three-month intervals year-round. Participants receive daily assignments and chores related to sustainability initiatives and organic farming (including readings and research), as well as the opportunity to design and implement individual projects. Upon completion of all units and responsibilities, interns receive a certificate in sustainability from Better Farm. College students may additionally receive course credit for completion of this program (pursuant to agreement by that individual's school).

Individuals are immersed from Day One in the local culture while working alongside other residents at Better Farm and in the Redwood community. Sustainability specialists visit Better Farm throughout the year to offer additional mentoring and guidance; and students may take any workshops scheduled during their time at Better Farm. Program participants live on-site and communally on the Better Farm campus in shared rooms. A flat fee of \$500/month is required to cover education costs, room and board.
