

End of the Road Ranch

The 80-acre Ranch is 10 miles from the Pacific Ocean in Oregon. It is 7 miles from the nearest town of 1300 people with: riverside park; bank; gift shop, Grange Hall, bakery; restaurant; video store; (5) churches; grocery store; library; post office; roadhouse\sport bar; fuel station and mini market.

The Ranch is surrounded by 20,000+ acres of logging land. It is a land locked island of 80 level acres surrounded on two sides by a wild salmon, trout, and steelhead river

There are 5 miles of logging roads and locked logging gates to get to the Ranch.

Warning: only ATT cell service available

It is the End of the Road Ranch's opinion that there will be a critical imbalance of food, water and energy by the year 2030.

This can be caused by any number of factors, such as: earthquakes, global debt, tsunami, weather patterns, factory farming, EMP, cost of oil, war, inflation or a total financial collapse.

What happens when the crisis does come?

How can a person survive?

Survival Options:

1. Hoarder - Regardless of how much you hoard, there is a limit.
2. Detainee of the Homeland Security Department – Give up your gun & freedom for security.
3. Sustainable Grower – Learn how to live Sustainable and Off the Grid.

The Ranch is a Grower Community. It is NOT a communal, political, religious, environmental, or militia community.

Every person in the Community is committed to increase their Permaculture, Sustainable and Off the Grid Knowledge and to participate in an outreach mission at the Sustainable Living Center. The Center is not located at the Ranch. Each member is willing to demonstrate and to teach their knowledge at the Center. There are two (2) afternoon sessions, one during the weekend and one during the week.

Each session is three (3) hours of supervised hands on (doing) sessions and one (1) hour of classroom. All the material and tools are furnished. The cost per session is \$25.

Each sessions is one of kind session, not a canned repeating workshop. The sessions are not open to the public, but are by application. Applicants are accepted based on their degree of interest. Only the serious need apply.

The subjects and times change with the seasons. If interested, email for application, times, and subjects

The Center is on Hwy 101 (Pacific Coast Hwy) in Lincoln City, Oregon 97367.

At the Center, a private bedroom and private bath includes all utilities is available at \$350.00/month.

- Eight (8) sessions are included at no cost. They are scheduled at times that would allow the participate to hold a full time job
- Thirty (30) day minimum commitment, but there is no limited in time, if participate passes the 30, 90, and 180 day reviews.
- Linens and towels are not furnished.
- No washing machine at house
- Kitchen and meeting room can be uses.
- Internet, phone service or cable if desired are an additional expense.
- No smoking in house or workshop
- Absolutely no drugs (legal or illegal) of any kind
- No Pets or children
- Large yard and off-street parking
- Local bus transportation stop at front of Center.

You will learn how to make a **Bokashi Machine**©. Bokashi is a Japanese term meaning 'fermented organic matter.' It is a two a two stage process - fermentation stage, and a composting stage.

How to make a **TomatoBarrel**© It is portable and uses the heat storing capacity of its water reservoir. This enables a longer growing season and minimal need for watering.

Build a **Chicken Sanctuary**©. Raising chickens use stationary coops often have a "run" added. Stationary structures buildup with nitrogen and odor.

You will learn how to build a **Kratky Tub**© It is a carefree technique that allows you to grow hydroponically without electricity, pumps, or wicks of any kind.

Build a **Yurt Cloche**© Extended growing times on the Oregon Coast is easier and cheaper with a Yurt Cloche©

Second Review: at the end of another 90 days you will be reviewed in the same area as the first review, but also on your:

1. Desire and wiliness to become a Sustainable Grower.
2. Wiliness to understand how people work differently

Third Review: at the end of another 180 days you will be reviewed in the same areas as the first and second reviews but also on your:

1. Desire to develop Sustainable Grower processes on you own

Result of a Review: The following could be the results of any review:

1. Continue Living at the Center
2. Placed in Jeopardy with repeat of review process
3. Asked to Leave the Center
